
We are always looking for students with innovative project ideas to get involved with. We encourage ideas that foster intercultural awareness as well as practical projects to assist families and communities.

The primary aims of the walk-a-thon are two-fold: First: To promote public awareness of the value of literacy for the world’s poor; and secondly, to raise money for shipping the books that we collect.

The walk-a-thon begins from the Passion Puddle on the Cook/Douglass Campus and ends with a literacy awareness rally on College Avenue.


The Spring Event
